Advisory Council Meeting Minutes

Monday, October 16, 2023, 4:00 pm

The Advisory Council of CareWell Services SW met on Monday, October 16, 2023, in the Burnham Brook conference room of the Kool Family Community Center, in Battle Creek, Michigan.

I. Call to Order

Chair Briel called the meeting to order at 4:07 p.m. Quorum was present.

II. Action Items

Motion by Tuggle, supported by Sherban, to approve the October 16, 2023, Consent Agenda which included the Advisory Council meeting minutes for September 18, 2023. Motion carried.

Wines shared the letter of resignation of Aaron Edlefson. He nominated his co-worker, Tailah Huerta. Ms. Huerta completed the application form, and it was added for review. Wines also requested to move Gelletich up on the agenda due to a scheduling conflict.

Briel moved to accept the motion to discuss the letter of resignation, the new nomination and to move Gelletich up on the agenda. Motion supported by Tuggle and seconded by Sherban. Motion carried.

III. Learning Session Presentation

Guest speaker, Taylor Benthin, presented on the Milestone Senior Services' nutrition program. Milestone Senior Services has been in business for 60 years, partnering with CareWell for approximately 11 years. Year to date they have served 97,117 meals, 714 clients. She stated the restaurant dining program stopped as of October 1, 2023. She requested we monitor the government cuts as nutrition programs could be impacted. She entertained any questions.

IV. Reports/Discussion Items

A. Wines delivered the CEO Report. She shared that the department of ACLS/MDHHS we fall under is currently Behavioral and Physical Health and Aging Services Administration (BPHASA). Looks like there is another name change in the future. She will share it once it is announced. New hires, Jodi Stiles, in the accounting department and the Executive Administrative Assistant, Valerie Barnaby, have both been onboarded and are doing a fabulous job.

Wines shared that no organization submitted a Request for Proposal (RFP) during CWS' last round for kinship care funding. Family Enrichment Center (FEC) reached out and asked for payment of expenses they incurred over the past fiscal year. Wines explained the steps taken to notify FEC of the RFP process, but they did not submit a proposal. In previous years, FEC did bid and was awarded the funding. Wines will issue an RFP for kinship care in Calhoun County only for the funding period that is left in our three-year RFP. Wines does not anticipate any other bidders.

It was also noted that Forks Senior Center (Albion), now has 396 members and Heritage. Commons (Marshall), which was open one year in July, has 424 members. She also advised that we are struggling in getting participation to run evidence-based programming in Barry County. Programs were cancelled due to lack of interest and sign up. Planning is underway to offer Active Choices, Bingo, and a three-part dementia/caregiver workshop.

- B. Porter reviewed Advisory Council Standards. Expect a new and more energized meeting format going forward in FY 2023-24.
- C. Financial: Gelletich reported on fiscal year-to-date financials through August 2023.

Wines advised training will be offered regarding funding from Gelletich. She will send notification once a time is scheduled.

Advocacy/Action: Tuggle presented questions regarding Ombudsman Services.

Briel reminded members that the Conflict-of-Interest forms need to be completed.

Porter reported that it is proposed that we no longer need to follow the Open Meetings Act moving forward. This means that members could attend meetings via Zoom. She will get confirmation and advise further on this.

Briel opened discussion regarding the position of Vice Chair for the Advisory Council. Motion by Tuggle to nominate Sherban, supported by Doster. Sherban accepted the position. The Vice Chair's role will be to serve as Chair in the absence of the Chairperson, which is currently Lyn Briel.

Briel advised the Policy Board does require a VA Representative. Our current VA representative, Aaron Edlesfon, resigned. He nominated his co-worker, Tailah Huerta. Ms. Huerta's application was reviewed. Motion by Sherban, supported by Bowers, to approve Huerta's application. Motion carried.

D. Program Director, Courtney, provided the MMAP Outreach report for Barry, Calhoun and outlying six counties for 2023. She also provided a comparison graph showing state numbers as well as Region 3B numbers expected for comparison. Also included was the State Health Insurance Assistance Program Contract Report for the FY 2023-2024.

V. Advocacy, Outreach and Programming

Porter is working on a letter to the Governor's office for all to sign and send regarding senior funding from the state 2024 budget. Will have available at the next meeting.

O'Dell and Tuggle reported on guardianship rulings from Michigan Senior Advocates Council – (MSAC) and professional regulation, Ombudsman, and no-fault insurance. Wines advised that CareWell will not advocate for no fault auto insurance reform, nor is this a matter the 16 AAA's in Michigan will tackle.

O'Dell requested that we have a speaker come in to discuss guardianship.

Tuggle also covered the concern of low wages for Ombudsmen. MSAC is pursuing research throughout the state on this matter.

The Advisory Council received program calendars of CareWell's senior centers outlining October's activities for reference as part of their meeting packet.

Briel and Wines discussed the meetings calendar for the fiscal year 2023-24 and the next date scheduled for November 20, 2023. Asked if there were any conflicts due to the Thanksgiving holiday. No conflicts were noted, calendar was approved.

VI. Council Member Time

Sherban reported that Kingdom Builders is working on the elevator. Otis is ready for funding. An invoice needs to be requested for review and payment from the Innovation Action funds. Porter will follow up on this.

VII. Adjournment

Motion to adjourn, supported by Bowers, seconded by O'Dell. Motion carried.

With no additional items to discuss, the meeting adjourned at 5:47 p.m.
